The early years are critical to developing a lifelong love of reading. You can't start reading to a child too soon!

- **Read together every day.**
Read to your child every day. Make this a warm and loving time when the two of you can cuddle close together.
- **Say how much you enjoy reading together.** Tell your child how much you enjoy reading with him or her. Talk about "story time" as the favorite part of your day.
- **Read with fun in your voice.**
Read to your child with humor and expression.

Know when to stop. Don't continue reading if your child is not enjoying it.

- **Be interactive.** Engage your child so he or she will actively listen to a story. Ask questions on your own and listen to your child's responses.

- **Read it again and again and again.** Go ahead and read the same book for the 100th time! Research suggests that repeated readings help children develop language skills.

- **Point out print everywhere.** Talk about the written words you see in the world around you and respond with interest

to your child's questions about words. Ask him or her to find an unfamiliar word every time you go on an outing.
